On May 8<sup>th</sup> 2020, the Bryan Fire Department responded to a structure fire at 326 Waco Dr. As Medic 1 arrived, they reported a small single story residence, with flames showing on the alpha side, and it was a major wind driven fire. As more crews arrived, Medic 1 further reported there was a person inside the structure. The Incident Commander immediately called for additional resources to facilitate the impending rescue. Engine 1 arrived on scene and the Company Officer performed a walk-around, ordered a line be deployed, and led the crew around the structure. Engine 3 arrived, established water supply, and then stretched a line to the Charlie side of the structure. As Engine 1 began fire attack on the Alpha/Bravo side, Engine 3's crew attempted to make entry. The house was nearly fully involved at this time, so Engine 3 had to flow water while making entry.

Acting Lieutenant LaRoche led his crew (Probationary FF Wiseman and FF Talbert) in through the Charlie side. They made it about 10 feet into the structure when Acting Lieutenant LaRoche found the victim. Engine 3's crew then grabbed the victim and drug him out of the structure. Once the crew made it to the Charlie door, Engine 2's crew was waiting to assist. They lifted the victim onto the stretcher and headed towards an awaiting ambulance. The victim was transported to the nearest hospital where he succumbed to his injuries shortly thereafter. Engine 3 was able to make the grab and give the victim a chance at survival because of the team effort of all personnel on scene. I want to recognize the members of Engine 3 for their brave and courageous actions.
